WHEREAS: We must increase the public's awareness of scoliosis and help children, parents, adults, and

health care providers understand, recognize and treat the complexities of spinal deformities

such as Scoliosis: and

WHEREAS: Scoliosis, an abnormal curvature of the spine, with no known cause (idiopathic), is a

condition affecting 2-3% of the population, or an estimated 7 million people in the United States. Scoliosis is a condition which strikes without regard to gender, race, age or economic

status; and

WHEREAS: An estimated one million scoliosis patients utilize health care yearly, with approximately

one of every six children being diagnosed with this condition eventually being required to

receive active medical treatment; and

WHEREAS: The primary age of onset for scoliosis is between ten and fifteen with females being five

times more likely to progress to a curve magnitude that requires treatment.

THEREFORE: I, John A. Kitzhaber, M.D., Governor of the State of Oregon, hereby proclaim June 2012 to

be

SCOLIOSIS AWARENESS MONTH

in Oregon and encourage all Oregonians to join in this observance.
