PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS, we must increase the public's awareness of scoliosis and help children, parents, adults and health care providers understand, recognize and treat the complexities of spinal deformities such as scoliosis; and
- WHEREAS, scoliosis, an abnormal curvature of the spine with no known cause is a condition affecting 2-3 percent of the population, or an estimated 7 million people in the United States. Scoliosis is a condition which strikes without regard to gender, race, age or economic status; and
- WHEREAS, an estimated one million scoliosis patients utilize health care yearly, with approximately one of every six children being diagnosed with this condition eventually being required to receive active medical treatment; and
- WHEREAS, the primary age of onset for scoliosis is between 10 and 15 with females being five times more likely to progress to a curve magnitude that requires treatment; and
- WHEREAS, screening programs allow for early detection and for treatment opportunities which may alleviate the worst effects of the condition:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kim Reynolds, Governor of the State of Iowa, do hereby proclaim June 2018 as

SCOLIOSIS AWARENESS MONTH

in Iowa and encourage awareness of and combating the spinal condition of scoliosis.
