Proclamation

WHEREAS:

Increasing public awareness of scoliosis will help children, parents, adults, and health

care providers understand, recognize, and treat the complexities of spinal deformities

such as scoliosis; and

WHEREAS:

Scoliosis, an abnormal curvature of the spine with no known cause, is a condition that

affects 2-3% of the population, or an estimated 7 million people in the United States,

without regard to gender, race, age, or economic status; and

WHEREAS:

An estimated one million scoliosis patients utilize health care yearly, and approximately

one of every six children who are diagnosed with this condition eventually being

required to receive active medical treatment; and

WHEREAS:

The primary age of onset scoliosis is between ten and fifteen with females being five

times more likely to require treatment; and

WHEREAS:

Screening programs allow for early detection and for treatment opportunities which may

alleviate the worst effects of the condition; and

WHEREAS:

Observing Scoliosis Awareness Month renews our commitment to raising awareness of

and combating the spinal condition of scoliosis and to recognizing the need for research

to reduce the pain and suffering it causes.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TIM WALZ, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of June 2020 as:

SCOLIOSIS AWARENESS MONTH
